Themen's organ trio features organist Pete Whittaker, formerly of The Nigel Price Organ Trio, and drummer George Double who has worked as sideman to Shirley Bassey and Jack Jones.



28 June Martin Speake's Charukesi

For 30 years **alto saxophonist, composer and improviser** Martin Speake has been exploring non-Western rhythmic and melodic approaches inspired by the music of many cultures. The latest incarnation is Charukesi, named after an Indian raga. It is direct, groove based music with compelling and memorable melodies rooted in a dynamic tuba and drums rhythm section. 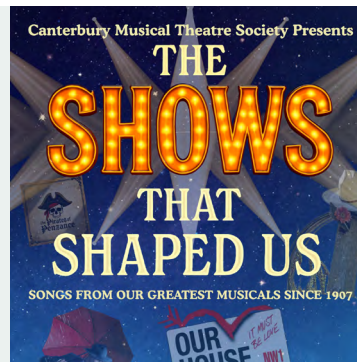

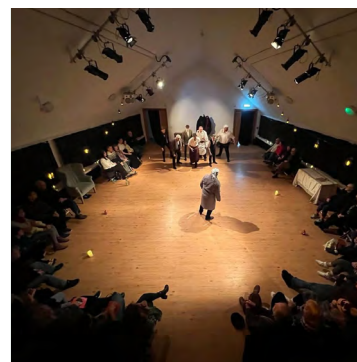

Join Constant Lark for an evening of bold storytelling, playful transformation and Shakespeare at his most entertaining.

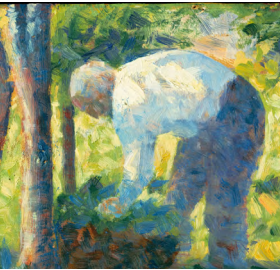
