The Horsebridge ARTbank is a place where donated and preloved art materials are available for you to take home by paying whatever you are able as part of our Pay What You Can scheme.

We know the **positive impact of creativity** on well being which is why it is important to us that **no one is excluded** from being able to access and enjoy art and craft materials.

The ARTbank is located on our ground floor and available to **visit anytime we are open**.

It operates as a **Pay it Forward** scheme, which helps people access free materials with no financial burdens or stigma. Anyone who is able and wants to support this initiative can contribute towards the fund by leaving a **pay it forward donation**.

We are accepting donations of unwanted art and craft materials which can be dropped in at the front desk. Special access sessions - specifically for community organisations, their users and contacts - are held regularly allowing access to the ARTbank outside of opening hours on selected Tuesdays.


30 March presents Steve Waterman




